#### AN EXCITING YEAR AHEAD!

Port Augusta Secondary School welcomes new and continuing students and their families to the 2021 school year.

Welcome to all our new staff and we trust their time at the school will be enjoyable and rewarding. I have been very impressed by the positive start to the year and I congratulate staff and students for their efforts. The school held a BBQ on the first day of school to celebrate the start of the year in recognition of everyone's efforts students new and to welcome our and staff. I also wish to acknowledge some of the outstanding results from our year 12 students last year which resulted in a SACE completion rate of about 94% and some very high individual scores. This also resulted in many students receiving their preferences at university and TAFE.

#### THE YEAR AHEAD AND BEYOND - EXCITING OPPORTUNITIES

This year is a very significant one for our school as it will see the consolidation of our plans over the last few years and a range of new initiatives to further drive our improvement agenda.

Our new Science, Technology, Engineering and Science (STEM) facility is now fully operational and delivering highly innovative programs across all year levels. This new facility is a world class learning environment for our students and together with new contemporary curriculum pathways it will help prepare our students for jobs of the future.

Last year the South Australian Government announced that our school will receive further capital works funding to assist preparations for year 7 students starting in 2022 and support predicted future growth of our school. This work has now begun.

This is a fantastic opportunity to further upgrade our school infrastructure and provide contemporary facilities for innovative learning.

These developments will further support our ability to provide world class educational opportunities for our students together with a broad range of pathways allowing all student to achieve success.

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#### WE NEED PARENT/CARER SUPPORT

There are several areas in the school that require both parents and the school to be working closely together.

#### Uniform

All students are required to be in uniform at school. This assists in the development of our school culture and identity and is also an important safety measure in that it quickly identifies potential intruders. Our policy clearly states that if a student is not in uniform they will need to remain in the main courtyard during breaks. Please contact student services if you need any support with uniform requirements.

#### **Attendance and Punctuality**

There are clear links between attendance and student achievement. Even missing one day of school means a student will have to make an extra effort to keep up with the rest of the class.

We will be keeping a close eye on school attendance this year and will contact parents where patterns emerge to ensure we are all working together to ensure students are taking full advantage of the opportunities in our school.

#### Did you know?

If you are absent 5 days every term this means that you would have missed half a year of school by the time you have finished Year 12.

Research shows that one day missed takes four days of effort to catch up.

#### Lunch Passes

As you would be aware lunch passes are only available for students in years 11-12.

We encourage all students to remain at school during the lunch period and we have excellent canteen facilities and recreation facilities for our students. However, if parents of year 11-12 students require their child to come home for lunch they must organise a formal lunch pass available through student services.

Parent and community involvement in our school will be very important this year. The school's Annual General Meeting is scheduled for February 25 at 5.30pm. ### **YES Animal Studies program**

The Animal Studies program in YES has some interesting new creatures this term, including a juvenile Central Bearded Dragon, some Rhinoceros Beetles and Antlions.

A competition is being held to name the new lizard, which arrived on Monday of week 4. She is proving a popular new addition and, having been hand-reared, she enjoys being handled and is very curious about students moving around near her enclosure.

The YES Centre obtained the Rhinoceros Beetle larvae in term 3 last year and they have now matured through their three stages into beetles.
